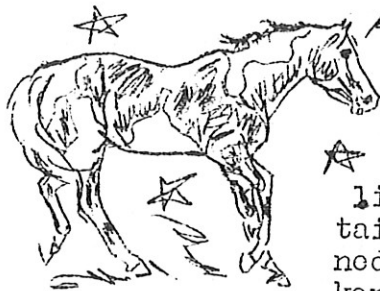

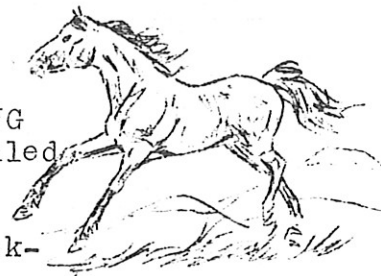

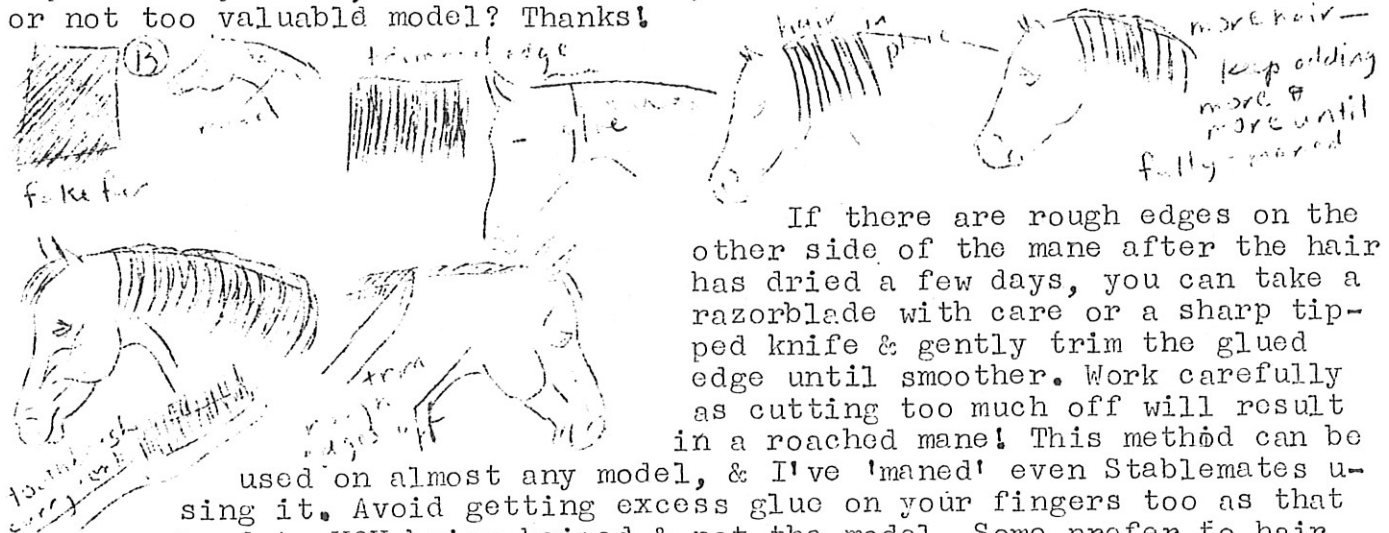

are there in the model show world? A=DOZENS! Many overlap in that they
register the same breeds, plus we collectors/showers are STILL finding
out about each other. There are clubs/registries all over the world, &
they too have eager members & collectors. Showing IS international!

HAIRING A MODEL HORSE: There are numerous ways to go about this, & we'll cover but a few methods. If any of you out there wish to submit additional information, please feel free to do so--help another shower, write?..

I. THE MANE: There are 3 methods we'll cover this time: A. cutting out a patch & gluing it on, B. cutting the fur or hair from the backing & putting it on, 3. rooting it in seams. A. A shortcut method is to take the fur (in this case, funny fur, fake fur, play fur, etc.) & cut out from the sheet a swatch that matches up to the shape of the model's plastic mane & positioning it in such a way so as to cover the old with the 'new'. Then this patch is glued into place, thus giving the horse a bit of a thicker neck but a nice haired look just the same. B. The second method using the fake fur again, or even dog, cat, horse, human or wig hair, is to take a small bit of it, carefully line it up in your fingers & trim it just slightly to get an even edge. Usually before this step you should apply a good glue, preferably Elmer's or craft glue (will get further details) to the seam where the mane emerges, applying only a small bit of no greater length than $\frac{1}{2}$ " to avoid the glue drying out. With the glue in place, take the trimmed hair & gently pat it down onto the glued seam, using the smooth trimmed edge as a guide along that seam. Repeat the gluing then applying hair until the full mane is in place. If you choose, you can add more fur in a second layer after the other layer has had sufficient time to dry thoroughly. Don't worry while applying the hair that the mane looks frizzy as that will be taken care of momentarily. After that second layer has dried (if applied), take a soft bristled toothbrush or small comb w/ fine teeth & gently comb the mane. This will allow excess fur that wasn't glued tightly to come out & thin the frizzies away. Some people tell me they actually use a hairspray to keep the mane in place! If there are bald places in the mane after brushing, again repeat the process of adding the fur & glue until it is covered. C. Rooting the mane: Personally I've not done this myself but have spoken with someone who has. The lady told she carefully used a heated knife to split the mane/neck seam & while it was pried apart, she stuck the hair/fur down into the seam & then let the seams go back together. As this was all I got, I'm not certain of trying it. Someone also indicated they carved out the seam & in the thin gap left they once more stuck the hair in there. And still it can be assumed there is a method to part the seam & root the hair by gluing it in place there. Further details as soon as I get them. As always, I take no responsibility in these methods or applying them as only two have I personally tried, successfully too, so please practice on an unwanted or not too valuable model? Thanks!




If there are rough edges on the other side of the mane after the hair has dried a few days, you can take a razorblade with care or a sharp tipped knife & gently trim the glued edge until smoother. Work carefully as cutting too much off will result in a roached mane! This method can be used on almost any model, & I've 'maned' even Stablemates using it. Avoid getting excess glue on your fingers too as that can lead to YOU being haired & not the model. Some prefer to hair the model before repainting it; others prefer adding afterwards. Do not apply the fur/hair if remaking a model until after the remaking is done. If using the softer glue like Elmer's, then the mane can be soaked off if desired removable. A haired mane (& tail) can work wonders for models!

YOUR EDITOR GROWLS, SPEAKS & LECTURES... We'll continue with the How To Hair article next issue, hopefully, but at this time I feel we need to clear up a few things..mostly about the MHSJ mailing & costs. It has come back to me that many feel the mailing rates are unfair to those copies' buyers living outside the USA. Now, on the bulk seal, only copies going to USA zip coded cities, towns, states are allowed. Therefore, any other country mailings are disallowed and the additional postage is, in many cases, horrendously high. Figuring a bit here, it costs on the bulk seal about 12¢-20¢ to mail one issue which is covered in the price of the copy. Now, off the bulk seal that same issue will cost 39¢ to mail! To send it to England or other countries over in Europe, it costs 50¢ for surface, & rather slow, mail. Airmail is out of sight for mailing to England, etc... Now, the MHSJ cannot make up the differences in the costs of mailing an issue on the bulk seal vs. mailing it off there. Hence, the people living outside the USA have to pay the extra to make up that gap in costs. The same amount as is paid on the bulk seal applies to the Canadian, England, etc. copies, but anything over that, they make up. It's unfair, I agree, but there is nothing I can do about it. Since they have to pay extra as it is, I will allow them to send in their currency as I can use it from time to time. If they have to get it exchanged, they end up paying twice, & the rate of exchanging it varies--plus they get charged for the service too. So rather than make them pay twice, their money from them is okay.. I hope that helps clear up some of the 'why' non-USA residents must pay so much higher rates. It just cannot be helped...At least their ad rates are the same as the USA residents'! And it costs the same to mail a letter there as in the States, but mailing on a bulk seal, it's a no-no... 887


Several have asked how I go about mailing on the bulk seal, so here goes. After the second checklist is made of the copies (I mark them off as 'present' by each name on my records); they are placed in stacks according to their destinations, by states. After all are so sorted, then each pile with 10 or more copies in it is separated for mailing as a bundle going to 1 state alone. After so sorted, the separate state bundles are then sorted via lowest to highest zip codes, & that one small state bundle is tied up so marked as 'California', 'Florida', 'New York', etc. After all 10-or-more-going-to-1-state bundles are finished, the time is there to sort the remaining copies having less than 10 going to a certain state. Here I try to help the post office by arranging the bundles as close together zip code-wise as possible. For instance, the Alabama, Georgia & Tennessee copies might be bundled together, as all their zips start with '3'. Then if there are still not enough in the bundle to make up 10, more are added from adjoining zip-coded states, again lowest to highest zip code sorted. These are then tied up in small bundles. To further complicate matters, any bundle having 10 or more copies bound for the same city must be separately bundled/tied up & so marked! Also, if any 10 carry the same first 3 digits of the zip code, they too are required to be so marked & bundled accordingly! Once all the bundles are so tied up & marked correctly, they are ferried to the post office for weighing & the computation of the postage. I might add here, too, that until all the checklists jive, by count & records, none are carried to the mailing station. Until that 'lost' copy is 'found', no copies are mailed because all the post office records & mine must check accordingly. Okay, we're ready to mail, so off to the post office. There they are weighed & together we must figure out how much each weighs, how many issues per pound, & the total weight in the mailing. Total poundages may vary from 155-170 POUNDS of MHSJ's--and that's just the bulk seal copies! Add 30-40 copies going out 1st class, plus 10-15 to Canada & England, & you can tell about how much postage it takes to send out one month's issues. Add to the fact there are some 600+ copies going out, & you can see why it costs so much to put out the MHSJ. And why the rates are the way they are...I hope this has cleared up some of the cobwebs on the subject as several people have been truly curious about all this. Yup, it's hard work, but it's my job.

GRRRIPES!! C/o L.Walter..We had SO many still on the files that I decided to give you all a treat--MORE of them. Have fun..Send NO more!

'I've noticed a common gripe..about high priced models, tack, etc. Well, here's my 2¢ worth..I spend hours, days, on a single horse, doing the best possible job I can do making that horse the very best for my time & effort. A good horse ought to cost the potential buyer a good price. After all the top model makers are the most versatile artists there are. Where else do you find the sculptor, saddler, hairdresser & photographer in 1 person? These people have every right to charge whatever they want because they're talented & must be rewarded for the time & expenses they have gone to to create a work of art..I've just completed a saddle which has taken 24 hours of work. To put that value into dollars & cents would make the price astronomical considering regular pay for skilled work. I deal only in custom work for very serious showers & they get what they pay for I stand behind the model showers whose prices are dear..The price of a good model has risen greatly (since 1972) & I thought then \$20 was dear, I barely blink at \$40 now...I feel the rise is justified by the general rise in the standard of model horse showing in North America. To be the best, you need the best. It's that simple..! Concerned Shower (Ed.Some good points there taken. I've seen this showers, model creators work & it is, to say the least, OUT OF THIS WORLD. If you took that 24 hours invested in that 1 saddle set, multiplied it by the current minimum U.S. wage the saddle would cost approx. \$56-60!! The top peoples' names are passed about & their reputations are made not only in their winnings but in their customers. As she stated, the best do deserve the best--and high prices.)

'It seems everyone has a registry but very few have good ones that are not expensive. \$2.00 a year plus a dollar or two for a letter, then 20¢ or more per horse is TOO high! Even \$2 (that's okay) is fine but to ask 15¢-25¢ per horse is outrageous! 5¢ a horse gets steep even if you only have a few horses. What happened to 1¢ a horse? Or 10 for 5¢? I like to register all my horses but with such high fees, who can afford it? Model horses is a hobby, not a living, & kids shouldn't ask so much!! A Frustrated Shower.. (Ed.Good points. Another common complaint is the club opens up, gets the fee & then wham! disappears. Too many folks want a registry or club; but many just don't know what it involves, like lots of letter writing, keeping records, organizing shows or races, advertising, planning newsletters or ads in other bulletins, etc. Now there WERE some people who started clubs/registries & ran them beautifully, with much concern for showers & their rights, but then time got them--as it does most all people, & they had to out of necessity close down or go into a dormant period. These aren't those we speak of. It is the newer people who decide to open one up not knowing what they are getting into! Anything like a club/registry takes so much TIME, people. Think thrice before you start one--or maybe offer to help out another club/registry owner or even take over one already established, but remember, there are clubs & more clubs, & how can they all be supported? Thanks.)

'..Anyone knowing beans about TB's would know Man O'War died in 1947. Anyone out there who says she/he has a son/daughter of Man O'War MUST be KIDDING! The horse would be at least a 30 year old, & that is if Man O'War were bred right up to his death...I think it's fine if you use real horses for sires/dams & I have almost all my foundation TB's with real parents. But let's watch out when we do it & for heavens sake, don't get geldings in there, either. It's okay if you get big, fancy, real pedigrees for the horses, but you've got to have the facts to back it up. If you're going to have real parents, make it realistic?' A Frustrated TB Lover... (Ed.Part of the problems caused here can be traced back to named models made by companies. Some actually ASSUME the horse is still living because there is a model made of it! Interesting points, Frustrated!) Whew....
